WORDS THAT SING

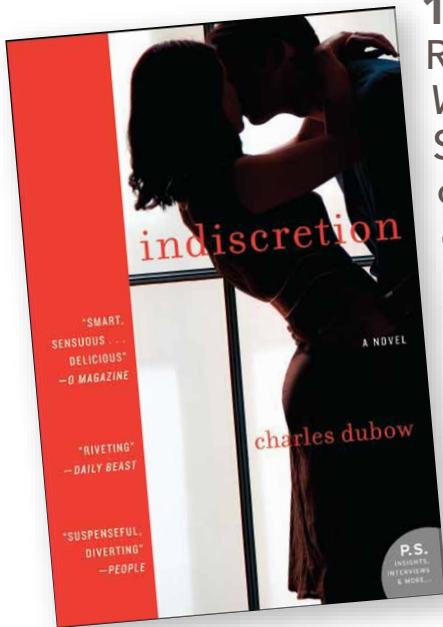

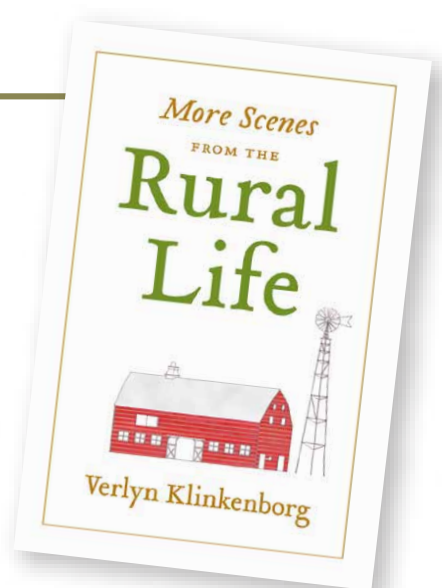

Historian Hugh Howard, author of *Houses of the Presidents*, offers intimate

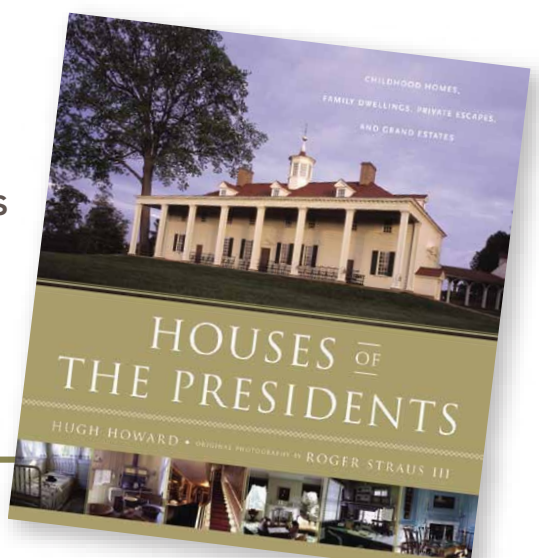
